3. Incident Details

It has been reported that a theft occurred on a tanker whilst berthed at Belawan Port. Two robbers, armed with knives were able to board the tanker, steal items of ship's property and escape unnoticed. The theft was discovered by duty crew once the tanker had departed and the vessel's CCTV had been reviewed. The incident was reported by the Company Security Officer. At the time the Ship's Master had not reported the incident to all Belawan authorities (Port Control, Navy, Police).

IFC Comments:

Indonesia ILO has provided the vessel details. The company security officer provided evidence of boarding and updated that three deck scupper plugs, six fire hose couplings, two fire house coupling keys and three fire hose nozzles were stolen.

3. Incident Details

While at anchor, the chief engineer is on his way to the comfort room when he encountered one unidentified perpetrator who pointed a gun at his head and locked him in the comfort room. Three other perpetrators were about to rob the ship but escaped empty-handed when they noticed that there was a crew inside the mess hall. The perpetrators escaped in a white motor vessel. The ship master reported the incident to the VTMS Manila, mustered all crew and inspect the ship properties on board. The personnel of Philippine Coast Guard Sub-station Paranaque proceeded to the location of the incident and conducted 'board and search' of all motor vessels transiting the nearby area. Nothing was found, and the team returned to the ship and conducted an initial investigation. The four intruders eventually fled to direction towards the waters off Baseco Compound in the vicinity of the Port area in Manila onboard a white color motor banca. The PCG proceeded to Baseco in order to apprehend the perpetrators based on the given description but yielded negative result.

IFC Comments:

This is the 10th incident in Manila since beginning of the year 2021 (7 incidents reported over the same period in 2020, Total of 10 incidents in 2020).

IFC RECOMMENDATIONS

IFC advises:

1. All mariners to report any incidents timely to the nearest coastal state and to the IFC at the earliest possible time.

2. Ships moving at slow speed or are choosing to remain at anchor in areas where sea robbery/theft is regularly reported should remain vigilant and adopt necessary and/or added security measures.

3. All mariners to take note on the description of the perpetrators and to take photos of the perpetrators if possible. Where available, CCTV footage capturing the incident should be provided to the coastal state authorities for follow-on investigation.

4. Shippers and Seafarers operating in the Sulu-Celebes seas are strongly recommended to be vigilant and to establish contact with the Philippines, Malaysia and Indonesia Authorities to report their presence. Please refer to IFC Spot Commentary 4/18 for the latest assessment of the situation in that affected area.

5. Shippers are advised to take note that the threat of terrorist activity in the maritime domain remains a possibility in the region due to ISIS and the Al-Qaeda. The possibility of this threat was previously quoted in Al-Qaeda's online magazine "Resurgence", which called for the disruption of global trade and shipping through acts of piracy, among other tactics. Shippers are therefore advised to exercise vigilance and to adopt self-defensive measures as stated in the Regional Guide to Counter Piracy and Armed Robbery against Ships in Asia, especially when transiting narrow choke points and areas which are known to have experienced incidents of sea robbery/piracy.
